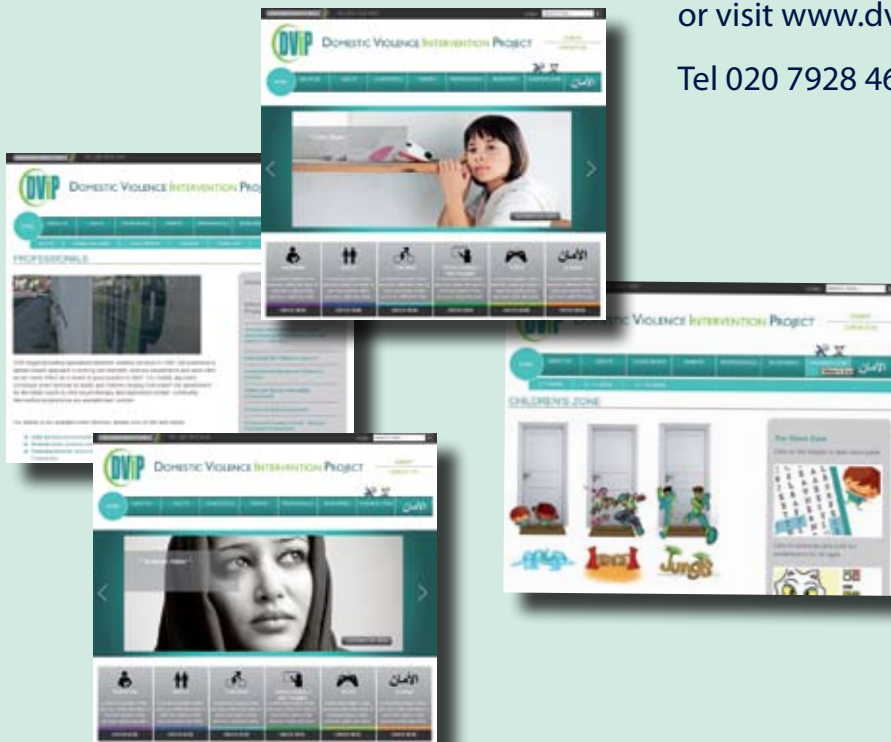

DVIP's team of expert practitioners deliver services to empower families to develop more positive and safe relationships.



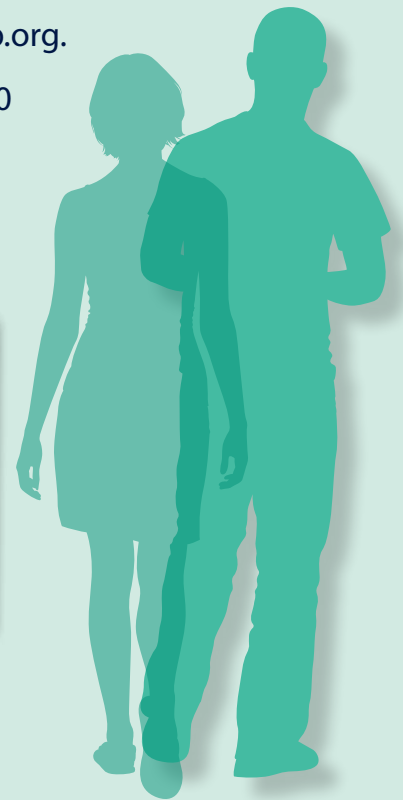
Training
